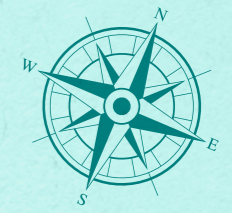

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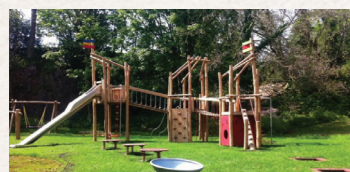


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SOMETHING FOR ALL THE FAMILY

Wild Clifton

SPECTACULAR SCENERY

Steeped in history, Clifton's spectacular position on the cliffs of the Avon Gorge boasts stunning views over Bristol to the south. It also provides a striking backdrop for Clifton's most famous landmarks and magnificent Georgian architecture.



Brunel's Bridge

Soak up breath-taking scenery from the Suspension Bridge. Designed by the great Isambard Kingdom Brunel, the bridge has become a defining symbol of Bristol, and a fantastic spot for a stroll to enjoy stunning views of the Gorge and beyond.

Dizzying heights

Take in the spectacular views from Clifton's Observatory. Sitting high up on the Downs, above the Suspension Bridge, you can wander inside the Observatory or travel through an underground passage to Ghyston's Cave.

The acclaimed poet John Betjeman described Clifton as 'the handsomest suburb of Europe'

Royal York Crescent

Stroll along this majestic Georgian terrace, once reputed to be the longest in Europe. From its unique position on Clifton's hillside, it is a striking landmark that can be seen from the harbourside below and even from as far afield as Bedminster in the south of the city.



DID YOU KNOW?

Clifton is home to a 'secret' railway... Clifton Rocks Railway, built inside the cliffs of the Avon Gorge, closed just before World War 2. Behind the entrance to the station at the bottom of the Gorge is a tunnel cut through the rock, which emerges next to the Avon Gorge Hotel.
